Taking on the Artistic Challenge

Our October meeting was an interesting journey through the life of local artist, Lynn Ward. She has always had a passion for drawing, but this eventually developed into a love of painting and Lynn is now a prolific artist, focusing mainly on Dales landscapes.

Lynn told us how she had spent seven years working at the Forbidden Corner, creating some enormous scenes on the walls to the grotto. These were very impressive, but it sounded like lonely, and sometimes very scary work, being mainly underground! Lynn was also responsible for painting the walls of Giovanni's pizza restaurant in Leyburn where she used Cosmopolitan's 'Top 100 Sexiest Men' as 'models' for the characters in her mural.

Some of you may remember when Lynn created some amazing murals for the Dunkirk exhibition at Tennants in 2000. She told us that this even involved painting the carpet to make it look like a cobbled street - not sure any of us would commission that transformation!

Lynn really prefers to work on big pieces with big brushes and this was more than obvious from the photos she showed us of the many murals she has created, both locally and further afield. However, her talent is undeniable and the examples of some of her local landscapes that she brought along were very impressive.

Following her talk, we were all issued with paper and pencils and had a go at creating our own masterpieces - not sure any of us succeeded, but it was fun!

Lynn now has a gallery and shop at Golden Lion Yard in Leyburn which, from what we saw, is well worth a visit.
